We have just completed another exciting, but challenging year for the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club.

During the 2018-2019 season our club has continued to tackle a number of key challenges on many fronts.

This year's highlights include the demolition of our clubhouse and see works underway on the redevelopment. I continue to enjoy the opportunity to meet so many different members, new and not so new from a broad cross section of the club and broader community.

Over the past 3 years as President I'm delighted to say that our people are simply amazing. The enthusiasm and culture is highlighted by how many offers for assistance our members provide in so many ways whenever the call goes out.

For a volunteer organisation to run effectively, we need everyone to put their hands up, roll up their sleeves and make a contribution in any way they can. I encourage everyone involved with our club to take the time to meet with new members, most of which live within our local community. Although we like to consider ourselves a small club, we are a large Victorian club that provides a diverse range of opportunities to members in all areas of Surf Life Saving that can be carried through life.

The core purpose of our club is our Life Saving patrols; however, we understand that people become involved in Life Saving for a variety of reasons and we need to support their involvement to ensure they remain involved. Surf Life Saving continues to change rapidly and as a club we will continue to adjust to the changes Surf Life Saving Australia, Life Saving Victoria and other stakeholders place upon us. To do this we have continued to build capability across all

areas of our club - Life Saving; Training; Competition; Juniors/Nippers; Fund Raising; Administration; Finance & Governance and Building Redevelopment. The one constant in this movement is change and we need to remain flexible and nimble to adjust as the movement continues to evolve.

The single biggest strategic objective on the Board's agenda continues to be the Clubhouse Redevelopment. This very large initiative continues to challenge our Board and Building Project Control Group in many ways. As a club we have lobbied extremely hard with all levels of government and community and have been very fortunate to secure over \$5.1 million in government (Federal, State and Local) funding for our project. We were also the first Surf Life Saving club in Australia to receive funding support from all levels of government for a Surf Life Saving Club, which we were told would never happen. This is something we all need to be extremely proud of, but our fundraising efforts must continue and Brad Papworth continues to do some amazing work in this area.

If you have any contacts that you think would be interested in a community partnership or providing funding support, please let Brad know.

I would also like to thank the clubs Project Control Group (PCG) for their focus and commitment in driving this project under Pete Smith's leadership. Like with all large construction projects, we continue to face lots of different challenges and our team has demonstrated a strong level of expertise in tackling these challenges. I have enormous confidence that this team will oversee the delivery of this project and address any challenges presented with great

professionalism, whilst protecting the clubs interests.

We are all committed to ensure we have delivered the best clubhouse we can as fast as we can.

This year we again came away with a 2nd place at the Victorian Senior State Championships and recently a 1st place at the Victorian Junior Pool State Championships. These were amazing results with such small teams representing the club on both occasions. The structured training programs available to members to improve their skills and competence, put in place by our Competition Manager, Tim Watson is continuing to give members varied opportunities to test their skills and keep people involved with our club. The Masters Club Champs was a highlight seeing some people who have not raced for a while give it a go.

Our Juniors led by Brett Thompson and Nippers led by Kate Walsh have continued to be an integral part of our club and, more broadly, a connection with community through the surf sports and surf education programs we provide. We are looking closely at how we continue to retain our Nipper members to ensure they naturally flow into our patrols in future years and provide the valuable service to the community for many years to come.

The 2nd year of our partnership with the Kids Plus Foundation was again a huge success. With the support of Steve Jewson as our program leader and many of our junior members providing water safety, the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club could provide children with cerebral palsy the experience of accessing the beach. After recently

receiving a grant for 2 beach wheelchairs and matting, we believe these vital pieces of equipment will greatly assist with the ongoing running of this program and further improve accessibility and inclusion for other members of the community coming to the Jan Juc beach.

This year the Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club and the Torquay Boardriders signed an historic MoU to see both clubs look at opportunities to become closer aligned. Both clubs members share a love of the ocean and a close connection by sharing the same beach, so we look forward to working together to find ways to build greater levels of collaboration between clubbies and surfers.

A huge thank you to each of the Board Members responsible for each area, Pete, Mel, Geoff (Rass), Brad, Bec, Davina, Brett (Thomo) and Tim - without their sacrifice and commitment this club would not continue to move forward. A special mention must also go to Sue and Meagan working in our office, your support is greatly appreciated. Finally, I would like to pass on my sincere thanks to all our members, club sponsors, event coordinators, Patrol Captains, trainers, assessors, Age Managers, coaches, Social Manager's, General Committee members, Audit and Risk committee members and Building Subcommittee members for your support this season and look forward to seeing you all back next season.

This report marks the end of a big year for my portfolio – the building redevelopment.

Reflecting on the year it was not without its challenges, however with the hard work of the Project Control Group, supported by the Board we have made significant progress.

The challenges we have encountered this year include but are not limited to:-

- navigating the external stakeholders approval requirements
- an active commercial building environment in Victoria causing pricing pressure
- locating asbestos that was not detected prior to demolition
- location of limestone karsts and the rectification of those.

The Project Control Group is actively engaged with the Project Manager to navigate these pressures and execute the best outcome for the Jan Juc Surf Lifesaving Club.

The unfortunate outcome of these highlighted challenges is that we will not have full access to the new facility for this coming season. We will have to operate a hybrid style with the finer operating parameters managed closer to the coming summer.

At present we have demolished the facility, completed the large retaining wall on the ocean side and completed the ground works ready for the ground floor slab to be poured in the next two weeks.

I would like to thank the PCG members and the Board for support as we navigate this project.

Congratulations to David Ulbrick on being awarded Life Membership to the Club. The presentation was made at the 2019 Presentation Night with Steve lannazzo providing details of the impressive history and involvement of David over the years.

I would also congratulate Doug Bartlett who, this year completed his 1000th hour of patrolling at the Juc - not bad for someone who obtained his Bronze on the 14/1/93 to assist with nippers, got the bug and just kept going.

According to the records currently on hand, Doug is the first member to achieve this.

Membership-wise there was a drop off in some areas, especially Associate memberships. Once the new Clubhouse is up and running with usable facilities then the aim will be to recapture lost members and seek new members.

Life Membership – Dave Ulbrick



David was awarded Life membership following consistent high levels of contribution across a broad spectrum of Club activities over a long period.

A 20 year patrol history included 4 years as a Patrol Captain,

1 year as Patrol Vice-Captain, with above average hours achieved in this time.

Committee positions included IRB Manager for 4 Seasons, Juniors Representative, and Lifesaving Services Manager for 2 years - creating various initiations of improvement in those areas.

Competition wise, Dave medalled in State/National titles individually and in teams. He has taken these skills, in conjunction with other senior members, into sourcing/training Members for events such as Open Patrol Competition, Champion Lifesaver, First Aid, etc. Jan Juc teams continue to medal at State/National titles as a consequence of the structures put in place.

Dave has supplied significant legal assistance and advice to the Club and the Board, in particular, involving Building Redevelopment, discipline and other matters as required.



I'd like to begin my report by thanking every club member and their families who completed patrol hours this season. This season, as a club we provided 5446.75 hours of patrol, including 1910.70 hours of water safety patrols. This is 996.60 hours more than we completed last year. The club should be extremely proud of the commitment we all provided this year to maintain a safe aquatic environment on the beach given our lack of club house facilities. In what could have been a very difficult scenario for our patrols, we were able to come together as a club and still provide patrols at Jan Juc Beach for every LSV rostered day this season.

Statistics for the season

Rescues - 19 (down from the previous season, a great indication of the vigilance of the patrols. This is also shown in the increase in preventative actions listed below, rather than rescues).

Preventative actions - 1449 (compared with 1263 in 2017/18).

First aid treatments – 12 (these are recorded first aid treatments. There were obviously many more minor treatments that were not recorded).

All things First Aid ran very smoothly from the well-equipped "site hut" first aid room this season. We were very lucky to secure the makeshift first aid room at a discount rate, and to have it kitted out beautifully using the cupboards Rass had stored from the old clubhouse! Great thinking as always, Rass you couldn't be more helpful, your work is tireless and very much appreciated.

All gear passed inspection without question and overall gear has been maintained very well this season. Thank you to those members who have re-stocked First Aid bags and helped keep equipment clean over the patrol season.

Just a reminder that it is really important to ensure all First Aid/Resuscitation gear is kept dry and sand free. This is so it functions correctly when we need it the most. Of course unpredictable weather and water are par for the course in surf lifesaving, so if any gear does get wet or damaged I just

need to be notified ASAP so I can attend to it promptly.

There were a lot less First Aid incident reports documented this season, 13 in total, which seems exceptionally low for Juc! A reminder to all members that it is a requirement to complete a First Aid log report in detail for all first aid incidents no matter how minor it may seem. This log is a legal record of the treatment and advice provided to the patient. It is the only documented evidence we have that can be called upon if needed to show the actions taken and care given by our members. Please complete the log in detail to the best of your ability in regard to the treatment you delivered and any referral for further care you recommended (regardless of the patients decision to follow your advice). See SOP 4.01- Logs and Reporting.

Looking forward to season 2019-2020!







2018/2019 - another successfully busy season in the Lifesaving Award area, amid the challenges of Clubhouse redevelopment; using a variety of external facilities to run our courses, along with Castles Drive office and the containers set up at Juc. This has been manageable. Thank you to all Trainers, Assessors, water safety and helpers who went the extra distance, helping out, preparing equipment and transporting equipment to ensure our courses ran as smoothly as possible. Thanks also to the Torquay Senior Citizens and Torquay SLSC for allowing us to run courses in their facilities. In return we have run First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation and Spinal Management courses for Torquay and the wider region.

332 new awards (only 35 short of the previous season) were conducted by our volunteers from July 2018 through to May 2019. Awards included: Radio; Resuscitation; Provide CPR; Surf Rescue Certificate; Bronze Medallion -Certificate II Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue); Advanced Resuscitation Techniques; First Aid; Spinal Management; IRB Crew and Driver; Silver Medallion Beach Management; Gold Medallion, along with many Training; Assessing; Facilitating; Safeguarding Children and young people; Junior Managers and Surf Sport awards. Certificates have been emailed from SLSA Surfguard to individuals in the month following their assessment. If unsure please check your emails from around that time, or contact LSV Volunteer Training to have them resent. Please make sure the email listed on your membership is correct. You can access your awards "Record of Results" through the Members' Area.

We welcomed 13 new Trainers, both young and mature age. We currently have five probationary Trainers and three probationary Assessors progressing through their awards. These people help to make up a strong Club base of around 30 Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators of various awards.

A further 375 current awards were deemed proficient at 79 annual Skills Maintenance Assessments, predominantly held across November and December 2018, with multiple awards assessed on any given day and most people

completing the theory components online. Well done and thank you everyone for your efforts, in continuing to requalify, enabling you to provide a much-needed service to the community.

Some of the recent changes in the second half of the season include:

- Success with Jan Juc SLSC piloting the new blended delivery to Adult Bronze Medallion candidates in December, ie all theory done at home prior to the course. This success means this blended style course is now an option for all clubs in Victoria going forward.
- For those of you who know what a "form 14" is (LSV summary page for all awards), these ceased being used as of February 1. All awards can now only be processed through the Axcelerate system via the iPad, which then feeds through to Surfguard. This should mean that providing all assessment components are completed correctly, the award should be processed within a few days.
- The Units of Competency for the Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Crew and Driver have been removed after only a few years in the system. This does not alter the components or length of the courses.
- The Provide Advanced Resuscitation Techniques HLTAID007 unit of competency will now be required to be completed every 3 years, much like the current First Aid award, ie a new award undertaken every 3 years, so if you obtained your ART between 2014 and 2017 you will be required to redo the award this season. Look out for LSV run courses around the state over the next few months, both in ART and First Aid.
- Provide CPR HLTAIDoo1 is now an annual requirement, not just for those wanting workplace CPR. This should not be too difficult as it will run as a blended course on Skills Maintenance day to work in with our current CPR format. You will just be required to enrol in a course and do 17 questions at home prior.



- D9 Trainer/Assessor/Facilitator Matrix (Personal Development and record of evidence) is now annually and due by July 30, 2019, or 2 weeks prior to the next course you are delivering or assessing.
- All LSV resources are having a major overhaul, with us now moving to use Public Training PowerPoints. We envisage a few adjustments may need to be made by LSV over the next 12 months as these are streamlined to our industry workplace. If you would like to provide us with constructive feedback to forward to LSV, please send an email.
- An Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA the governing body for Registered Training Organisations, TAFE sector) update has meant Assessors are required to complete a single unit of competency - Design and deliver assessment skills TAEASS502, whilst Cert IV Training and Assessing holders have upskilled this unit along with Address adult language literacy and numeracy skills TAELLN411.
- There are currently further opportunities for members to undertake the Trainer Enterprise skill set (theory for new Trainers) and Cert IV in Training and Assessing.

Congratulations to quadruple TOFF award winners, Sophie Costa, Sophie Gordon, Drew Green and Kiah Shanahan, all gaining multiple awards and scoring 90 points each for the season. A great effort! Congratulations to Olivia Jenkins and Jason Scammell for receiving Most Outstanding Junior awards, both happily providing water safety and scenario training in Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate courses.

Special mention and thank you to several people who have played major roles in our success this season:

- Steve Scammell & Brett Thompson and all the helpers and parents at SRC course who helped with water safety, food and resource prep and First Aid scenario training. Our Junior/Cadet members were fabulous helpers, giving up their school holiday time to help.
- Bronze Medallion and Development Camp Managers, Grace Lightfoot and Indy Flexman and their hard working team for delivering another successful and action packed December Bronze Medallion Camp. A successful new day camp format at Torquay SLSC, learners enthusiastic to arrive each day and trainers and helpers making it through the week without one illness. Thanks to the parents, who helped throughout the week
- Everyone involved with all other awards and Skills Maintenance days, without whom we would not function to provide these opportunities.

- Richard Ibbotson, Jemma Ugrin and Rhys O'Brien and teams for having Lifesaving resources maintained ready for course training. Special thanks to Brett Swan who not only maintained IRBs, but generously drove IRBs for multiple courses and Nipper training Sundays over a four month period.
- Dean Sibun and Anthony Reyntjes for their leadership in running IRB courses and mentoring new Trainers through. Mal Leigh-Smith spent much time preparing and presenting a report on success, hurdles and suggestions for sustaining members and their lifesaving awards to ensure we continue to provide our community beach service and growth within the club and extended community growth.
- Our core group of senior mentoring Assessors and Trainers for sharing the workload and supporting our growing team; making my job much more achievable. Thank you for giving your time and experience, particularly during your annual leave!
- Will McCance, as Training and Assessing Manager, who continued to lead and mentor the Trainers and Assessors development, along with Facilitating courses himself and sharing the administrative burden of award processing and record keeping.
- Geoff 'Rass' Thompstone continues his many hours of administration in Skills Maintenance processing, along with Sue Bettanin, Kathryn O'Bree and Meagan Mifsud for behind the scenes tireless administrative and financial work.
- Dean Hemburrow, Deb Lowe and Amelia Sanchez and Volunteer Training team at LSV who have moved on to new endeavours. We wish them all the best and thank them for their tireless efforts over the past seven years.

LSV has undergone some management restructuring and we now welcome Andy Dennis - Public Training and Safety General Manager, Micah Spedding - Volunteer Training Manager and team.

As we envisage the Clubhouse redevelopment will continue on throughout the 2019/20 season, it is presumed the timetabling, format and location of courses will be somewhat similar to this season gone. We hope further opportunities for area courses will be available through the new LSV format shortly.

Special Event First Aid. Thank you again to our skilled awesome First Aid teams who have helped at Carnivals and particularly our 21st Danger Swim Series and 16th Bells Bash. Your time, effort and expertise are truly appreciated.



Another year down and our Training and Assessment team has been busy planning, delivering and reviewing courses to ensure we can continue to deliver high quality service to beach goers and meet our patrolling requirements.

Outside of delivering the courses/awards outlined in Davina's report, our Trainers and Assessors have been busy attending numerous planning, training and development sessions at both a local and state level to complete their professional development requirements. Without which we are unable to maintain our training and assessing awards and hence unable to train or assess courses/awards. It should be noted that our Facilitators have been busy this season in completing their Cert IV upskill, in response to changes in RTO requirements.

This year we welcomed several new Trainers who have done a fantastic job in assisting our Training and Assessing team in the delivery of numerous awards (i.e. SRC, Bronze, ART, First Aid and IRBC/D). Becoming a Trainer is no easy feat and requires a lot of time and dedication to complete the required units before you can begin training. As per last year, there has been limited opportunities for

members to gain their assessor or facilitator skill sets and has meant we still have a shortfall in the number of Assessors and Facilitators. This is an ongoing challenge for the Club and one that is outside the control of the Training and Assessing team given this relies on State run courses.

The Training and Assessing environment is extremely complex and one that is constantly changing. As such, I must commend all Trainers and Assessors who have stuck with us this season, many have given up a lot of time to ensure all the lesson plans, relevant paperwork and evidence is compiled for each course. This is no easy feat and often done outside of the classroom.

Finally, thank you to all our Trainers and Assessors who have given up their time throughout the season to make our courses possible, with a special mention to Grace and Indy who did a fantastic job in the planning/coordination of Bronze Camp without a Club House. We hope to see you all again next year and hope we can continue to facilitate the provision of new awards, knowledge and skills.





As I write this report, we have already made inroads into this amount but will still require the support of our members and philanthropic partners to reach this goal. This is a once in a generation project and great opportunity for our members to contribute to this fantastic new facility.

Annual Result

The Club reports a profit for the 2019 year of \$1,024,820. This compares to a loss for 2018 of \$97,790. Both years contain significant non-operating items relating to the redevelopment of the clubhouse. The current year profit is after recording \$950,000 as capital grant revenue associated with the clubhouse redevelopment. The 2018 loss is after a non-cash expense item of \$293,871 associated with the write down of clubhouse assets. Club redevelopment costs have been capitalised and are reflected on the balance sheet, not in the annual profit and loss statement. Excluding capital grant revenue, the underlying profit for 2019 was \$74,820.

Business as usual – ongoing operational

Again, the 'business as usual' areas of the club have been very stable financially. Clubhouse activities, lifesaving services, lifesaving skills and development, juniors, competition and operational capital equipment expenditure have all reported stable, predictable financial outcomes.

Income and expenses across these core club activity areas showed little unexpected material variance over levels of income and expenses in 2018. Notable areas of variance over 2018 include:

- Rental costs associated with our temporary premises at Castles Street.
- Reduction in bar income and associated costs following clubhouse demolition.
- Additional salaries cost with costs associated with supporting the move, ongoing shop support and onboarding and training new office admin support.
- Reduction in interest income as a result of lower average cash investments and lower interest rates

There were no other significant business as usual variances of note. Sound monitoring and cost control by club committee and executive have ensured no surprise outcomes across core areas.

Fundraising and Events

Brad Papworth and the fundraising team delivered another solid year of fundraising events, with combined 2019 income from our core events (Danger Ocean Swim Series, Bells Bash Cliff Run, Golf Classic Day and Grand Final Eve Lunch) being \$157,521. This is just behind our combined 2018 income of \$165,698. Lower Golf Day

revenue was the most significant contributor to this difference. The combined net profit from these events was \$68,297 which is down on the \$84,892 achieved in 2018 and more in line with the \$75,510 achieved in 2017.

Clubhouse Development Activity

The Club has maintained a focus on philanthropic activity as our clubhouse redevelopment progresses. Our project finances have continued to benefit from this activity with clubhouse donation income (including for treads) totalling \$52,230 this year. This compares to \$116,100 in 2018. As redevelopment work progresses, our capital grants funding has also commenced to flow. The \$950,000 capital grants revenue recorded for the year comprises \$500,000 from Victorian government grants, \$200,000 from Federal Government grants and \$250,000 from Surf Coast Shire grants.

In 2018 the carrying value of the old clubhouse assets and fixtures and fittings was written off with a net impairment cost to the club of \$293,871. During 2019, as works continue on the redevelopment, the club has incurred \$279,994 in project redevelopment costs which have been capitalised, bringing total redevelopment costs capitalised to \$521,378 as at 30 April 2019. Subsequent to year end a further \$1,051,042 (inc. GST) has been paid to the main works contractor, as a first progress payment under their contract. At year end, the club has estimated its capital commitments under existing contracts associated with the redevelopment to be approximately \$6,140,000. These commitments will be funded from a mix of club funds, undrawn government grant commitments, borrowings and continued philanthropic efforts.

Maintaining our operating assets - continued investment

The Club purchased \$37,150 in equipment during the current year including one Thundercat rescue craft, 2 IRB motors, 1 IRB fuel cell and a Patrol equipment trailer.

Thanks to our bookkeeper Meagan Mifsud (and to Sue Bettanin as her support) in the maintenance of our general ledger and supporting financial records. It has been an uneventful year in that respect, which is a sign that systems and processes are working as they should and that the club is maintaining full and timely visibility over its finances and associated reporting.

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Fixed Assets

Buildings are brought to account at cost or at independent valuation.

Depreciation

The Committee have endorsed a policy of depreciating fixed assets using the straight line method rather than the diminishing value method.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets have remained the same and are:

Inventories

NOTE 9 - BUILDING REDEVELOPMENT

The Surf Club continued its preparation for the redevelopment of the Clubhouse during the year. The old clubhouse was demolished, construction was successfully tendered and main works on the site commenced. During the year club incurred and capitalised \$279,994 of development costs and carries total capitalised costs of \$531,378 at the end of FY19 (FY18: \$241,383). At year end, the club has estimated its capital commitments under existing contracts associated with the redeveloment to be approximately \$6,140,000. These commitments will be funded from a mix of club funds, undrawn government grant commitments, borrowings and continued philanthropic efforts.

NOTE 10 - GOODS AND SERVICES TAX AND TAX REFORM

The Surf Club is registered for Goods and Services Tax which is remitted on a cash basis. The Surf Club is also endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as an Income Tax Exempt Charitable Entity and as a Deductible Gift Recipient.

NOTE 11 - ASSOCIATION DETAILS

Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club is an association incorporated under the Victorian Associations Incorporation Act and is domiciled in Victoria.
