PRESIDENT REPORT



We thought that challenges of season 2019/2020 would be behind us, but our 2020/21 season just kept throwing out the challenges and as I write this (in lockdown) it looks like we will continue to need flexibility and patience dealing with this pandemic for a little while yet.

The challenges experienced at the end of last season and throughout this season continue to test everyone's resilience. I am proud to say that regardless of the challenges we faced through the loss of all our major fund-raising events in their normal form, we have come through in a healthy position posting a small surplus. I can also advise that the club's previous highest membership was 900 and this season we passed this mark and reached 1288 members.

This result is testament to all our incredible members standing by the club and continuing to support in whatever way they could. We experienced significant financial tests, but through our strong governance, financial management and operational arrangements we remain strong and managed to grow all our programs, whilst ensuring our core operations were delivered. Introducing our Community (Social) Membership has been extremely popular and proves that the culture and environment we foster is something people want to be part of. Spread the word, the doors are open and we would love to see more people take the opportunity of becoming a member of our great club.

The season started with the official opening of our new clubhouse. It was a COVID safe event, attended and opened by Federal, State and Local Government representatives. Not quite the

grand event for the members we had hoped for but after coming out of the harsh COVID restrictions imposed on Victorians, being able to have this gathering was somewhat of a luxury and important for us to move forward. It was certainly another proud moment in the history of our club with it livestreamed to anyone who was not able to attend in person.

With the build complete, we are still putting the finishing touches on the project, with the service lift and function room chairs (150) ordered and waiting installation, whilst rattling the tin to finish off the training room furniture, function room tables, multimedia & CCTV all next on the list to complete the project. If the pandemic had not prevented our fundraising events last season, I have no doubt all of the fit out items would have been fully funded and finished.

The impact of the new clubhouse was felt immediately, creating a point for us to come together for lifesaving purposes and socially with the hospitality space proving to be a very popular connection point for our members and visitors to the club. It is great that the club has remained family friendly and a place that everyone feels welcome, no matter what age or connection you might have to the club. The club's bar has created lots of opportunities for everyone to connect during the season with Stew Talbot doing an amazing job of promoting and co ordinating the volunteer bar roster. The time and effort Stew has put into this role is

A huge thank you again to each of the Board Members responsible for each area, Pete, Mel, Geoff (Rass), Brad, Grace, Steve, Brett (Thomo) and Tim - without their sacrifice and commitment this club would not be in the position we are in today. I would like to again thank Mel for her strong financial presence and respected guidance throughout the year to ensure we make balanced decisions. We have certainly come through this COVID impacted year in a very healthy position.

A special mention must also go to Sue, Meagan and Carolyn working in our office, your support is greatly appreciated, especially your flexibility in working arrangements and no fuss attitudes.

Finally, I would like to pass on my sincere thanks to all our members, Club Sponsors, Event coordinators, Patrol Captains, Trainers, Assessors, Age Managers, Coaches, Social Managers, Bar Volunteers, Merchandise managers, General Committee members, Audit, Finance and Governance committee members and Building Subcommittee members for your support this season and look forward to seeing you all back next season.

VICE PRESIDENT REPORT



The 2020/21 lifesaving season presented some challenges from a lifesaving perspective, however as our history has demonstrated on so many occasions, the members of Jan Juc Surf Lifesaving Club rose to challenges presented.

As the Vice President, a specific portfolio of responsibilities is not allocated, which allows for special projects to be undertaken. Projects that would make it more difficult for other Board members to manage their portfolio of responsibilities.

For the past two years as VP, I have overseen the re-development of our new facility. My involvement in this project commenced approximately 15 years ago. As with all great projects, it started with informal banter within a small group about redeveloping the clubhouse to meet what we foresaw were the needs of growing membership and local community.

In March 2011 the initial vison was formalized, by the then Club Executive, with the creation of a Building Committee – Peter Smith, Steve Jewson, Jack Redden, Andrew Mather, Wes McDonald, John Van Ooi, Andrew Flanders, David Ulbrick, Simon Breer with the assistance of Andrew Downes. With six external stakeholders, the ensuing 8 years involved a lot of meetings, redesigns, bureaucratic processes, hurdles, roadblocks, persuasion, community and member engagement sessions and finally, the funding and approval of the design.

There is no doubt that at times many of us wondered if we would achieve the vision for our Club. The project commenced at \$2.1 million in 2010, increased to \$3.5 million in 2011, culminating in 6.5 million when we finally sought tenders.

To ensure best practice a Project Control Group was formed to oversee the execution of the construction phase – Peter Smith, Peter Saw, John Van Ooi, Andrew Van Meel, David Ulbrick and Clint Fraser. Once again, this group was presented with many unforeseen hurdles that saw the timelines of project delivery pushed out and funding management stretched.

This somewhat simplistic summary involved over 4,000 emails, 840 trips to the club in the last two years and countless hours of team meetings. But in June 2020 we were handed the keys to our amazing new facility. While we could not enjoy a full year in our facility, we have had the opportunity to commence utilizing the new space. Upon moving into and setting up the new space, racking, storage etc., we have been able to gain an understanding of the areas that work well and meet our needs and also some elements that require adjustment. This will be ongoing, and the newly formed Facility Management Team are working through the first round of

amendments that have been identified.

During the main facility development period, the opportunity to redevelop the Observation Tower (Shark Tower) through a separate grant became available. After benchmarking the build costs, we determined it was most efficient to add this to the Hutchinson Builders scope of works.

The redeveloped Observation Tower was handed over to the JJSLSC in June 2020. This new development has refreshed the existing upstairs observation tower and added a small café space below. While we have a commitment to assign this to an operator that will deliver a youth training facility, due to the truncated nature of the COVID-19 operating parameters, the Board chose to keep the operation in-house for the 2020/2021 season. The vision is to offer local youth – not just club members – an opportunity to access training programs in food handling, barista, stock control etc.

VICE-PRESIDENT REPORT CONTINUED

While the commitment for those that joined me in the formal building committees has been significant, I have also drawn on the vast experience of our membership base for those informal coffees to discuss single elements of the project for the assistance and guidance required to deliver such a great community facility. Although there has been scores of people directly assisting in the development, each member that has contributed to club fundraising, cooking snags, rattling tins, standing on check points, or floating on a board or any number of other activities we have undertaken to raise the required funds for the project has made a contribution and should be proud.

During the year we negotiated a new surf camera agreement with Coastal Watch, if you want to see the beach conditions at Jan Juc hop on their cam. With the new web site development, we hope to have a link to the web cam.

While drafting this report I contemplated my time at the Jan Juc Surf Lifesaving Club. From gaining my qualifiers certificate on the 30th Jan 1982, I can only remember being proud of being part of a great and unique community organization. We have such a proud legacy of being progressive, not always first to market, but certainly early adopters. Here are a few, and not all from the past 12 months.

- Including sun protection for nippersrecognized with a Sunsmart Award
- Donating all funds from an intersection collection to the bush fire appeal
- Donating equipment to clubs in need

- Creating strategic alliances with community organizations – most resent – Torquay
 Boardriders – to my knowledge the second surf club in Australia to achieve this, Torquay
 Lions and Torquay Rotary among others.
- Using Bronze and SRC children as Age Group Managers
- The Kids Plus Program, which will be a feeder to the Starfish Nipper program next season
- Introducing our Indigenous youth to the surf program
- Implementing a youth training facility
- Having the foresight to commence the facility redevelopment project and create a community space – it has been very rewarding to see so many local families with young children sharing our space on a Sunday afternoon.

While this is not a definitive list, it provides examples of a Club and organisation that operates as part of our community. We offer our young members many opportunities to develop skills and experiences that will assist them in life and to give back to the community, in addition to the amazing aquatic knowledge they gain.

The parents of our Junior members should be proud and excited with the many seasons that lie ahead.

SECRETARY REPORT



During the mid-months of 2020/21, the approaching season, was filled with doubt, trepidation and uncertainty as to whether a Patrol Season would eventuate and if so in what form. The Board, also, had to plan in contemplation of the potential financial loss incurred in fundraising, events, sponsorship and Membership Fees, due to restrictions/impositions arising out of the Covid 19 crisis.

Once Lifesaving Victoria determined that patrolling would occur on Victorian beaches, albeit in a completely restricted manner, members were "requalled" in an entirely different format with no actual physical involvement other than the swim section. In small groups, an Assessor demonstrated and provided Covid Patrol instructions and precautionary measures. This method at least provided the impetus to have sufficient members to patrol over the season, with most of the previous year's members proficient.

Whilst patrols commenced on a basis of 6 core members, this was eventually expanded to 10, then opened completely. A longer than normal season stretched patrol resources,

however, with great resolve the Club was able to provide the expected water safety to the beach users.

As Lifesavers/Club Members, we belong to a unique volunteer organisation SLSA / LSV – this past season in Victoria there was a commitment of thousands of hours patrolled state-wide, 602 rescues, 232,000 preventive actions, first aid and other community support – all achieved and managed through the unprecedented Covid19 pandemic. Patrol hours at Jan Juc, even with reduced patrol numbers totalled 3841 hours, which included 1504 water safety hours - great effort!

The Board, deferred the normal membership renewal notices for a period due to the

overall financial state of the community, however once released, the response from members was magnificent and the support overwhelming with memberships flowing in at a great rate. The Board is most appreciative of this support and confidence in the future of the Club. In fact, membership this year totalled 1288, the largest in the Club's history – boosted, no doubt, by the increase of Community (Social) Memberships.

The dream became a final reality with the opening of the new Clubhouse in December – as members we all should be very proud of the new building which now provides us the opportunity to enjoy and utilise an outstanding facility. Whether it be patrol activities, social activities, extra storage etc.,

the facility is now the envy of other Lifesaving Clubs and is being acknowledged as setting the benchmark for new constructions.

Special thanks to Sue Bettanin for her ongoing support and assistance over the past season.

I offer my congratulations to the members awarded on the pages of this Annual Report for their achievements.



LIFESAVING SERVICES REPORT



The 2020/21 patrol season was like no other, with our patrols successfully patrolling through a global pandemic, working within ever changing COVID-19 restrictions and complying with all government restrictions.

We understood the patrol season would look different from the start with our Legends Patrol kicking off the season in mid-November 2020, sporting a patrol of only six Core Members, which was the maximum number allowed at the time. The Legends had to QR code in, sanitise all touch points and wear a surgical mask at all times. They had to carry additional PPE, this included gowns, goggles, gloves, N95 masks and sanitiser, everything needed for open heart surgery, but this kit had to be put on before treating any patient while on patrol. Luckily, restrictions eased and apart from a snap five day lockdown in February, where we returned to our limited core patrol and masks, patrols returned to normal by the end of the season.

This season we had seven Core Patrols Teams, which were made up of 38 core members. These core members are leaders from the club, have gained all awards necessary for their position and are experienced in patrol operations. The objective of the core group is to ensure our patrols are equipped with a strong group of leaders, to cover the compulsory awards and to upskill active members into core positions as well. We also had another 125 Active Patrollers this season, these members selected the days which worked best for them to patrol. It is hoped that our Core groups will continue to grow with more Active Members choosing to join the patrol teams.

Working alongside our beach Lifesavers, Jan Juc also hosted a Lifesaving Victoria, RWC site. This site was used by both Lifesavers and Lifeguards and was one of three state sites to be selected to support the extended patrol season. The benefits of having extra operational capacity at Jan Juc This season this included responding to major incidents at Roadknight, Pt Addis and Whites Beach.

was evident in the number of call outs this service completed. This season this included responding to major incidents at Roadknight, Pt Addis and Whites Beach.

We are so incredibly proud of all our Lifesavers this season who managed thousands of people a day, disappearing sandbanks/ beach access ramps and heavy surf. The patrol teams stepped up to all challenges thrown at them and at the end of each day every person who came to Jan Juc Beach, had a great beach day.

FIRST AID REPORT



With COVID restricting travel we had a very busy summer on the beach making it also busy in the area of first aid. It was great to see how well patrol members adapted to the use of PPE and COVID changes when providing first aid care to the public.

The cooler weather didn't stop all those desperate for a local holiday from visiting us at Juc. First aid supplies were well used and we went through more Ventolin this season than the last 3 combined. A big thank you to those who called or sent messages to me letting me know when supplies were used or running low - this helps a lot!

How nice it was to set up our spacious new first aid room this season! So much storage available so everything has a place, cupboard signage from Maree (Patron Signs) makes it simple and quick to find supplies as needed and the addition of a fully funded brand new patient trolley means we have a comfortable, safe working space to treat two patients at once. This season also saw the introduction of our brand-new, top of the range emergency response and training defibrillators from ZOLL, we were also able to secure grant funding to cover a large portion of the cost of the new devices. Thank you to all members who took the time to review the training PowerPoint and info I sent out and to trainers running our skills maintenance sessions for covering device usage as it is a little different. Providing education was a little more challenging with COVID restrictions this season, thankfully these defibs make use extremely simple and can talk you through every step if required. If anyone is still unsure of how to use these devices please reach out now that we can be more face to face.

As always, our Juc FA gear passed inspection without question and I am grateful for how well our gear has been maintained this season. Thanks to all those whom took the time to clean

up at the end of patrols and helped to ensure our equipment is in working order. This year a special mention to Amanda and Steve Scammell for their help prepping gear for inspection and maintaining the bum bags throughout the season. Geoff 'Rass' Thompstone for his endless work helping whenever required and as always for ensuring our oxygen supply was topped up all season. Sue for all her assistance with new COVID procedures we needed to write and for securing all the gear we needed to be COVID safe in the FA room.

I know a lot of others spent time helping check gear when patrols were quiet or weather inclement, all very much appreciated whilst I was less available this season.

LIFESAVING SKILLS DEVELOPMENT REPORT



Well it certainly was a challenging 2020/21 season for training. We started the season under directives from LSV that only awards essential to lifesaving were to be run under very strict guidelines and Skills Maintenance was the immediate priority. I know many of our members struggled with the new Skills Maintenance process, but I feel this may be a process that will remain in years to come. Despite the many IT issues with the new LSV platform and the COVID restrictions, we managed to get over 100 lifesavers requalified!

A huge thank you goes to Jaci Chin-Jewson who developed and implemented the Training area CovidSafe plan and all our trainers and assessors who continually give of their free time to ensure Jan Juc has qualified lifesavers – Davina Jackson, Geoff Thompstone, Will McCance, Finn Dripps, Sophie Gordon, Jemma Ugrin, Freddie Dripps, Jason Scammell, Bec Johnson, Anthony Reyntjes, Marcus Dripps and a special mention to Isabella Heather who ran our adult Bronze course which had to run over 4 weeks!

Some frustration was experienced among members who just wanted to complete awards and I am proud to say that, as a Club, we managed to run all course awards despite the restrictions we were forced to run under and I thank everyone for their patience and understanding.

We managed to put through 22 SRC's, 31 Bronzies, 5 IRB Drivers, 5 IRB Crew, 6 First Aid, 6 ART and 5 trainers. Please see the awards section in this report for more details.

I ask that if you are interested in training awards or if you were a trainee trainer this season that you ask the new Lifesaving Skills Development Manager how to go about getting started

as we will be short of qualified trainers after a season where we were unable to use trainee trainers due to COVID restrictions.

I will be standing down as Lifesaving Skills Development Manager to focus on our new Starfish Nipper Program – a Nipper Program for children and young adults with special needs, as well as running our regular Kids Plus Program for kids with cerebral palsy.

Again thank you to all those dedicated members who assisted me in this role over the past two years.

In a season that was marked by disruption and the need to be flexible, the Jan Juc Surf Boat section had great success which will provide a solid foundation for the future.

We saw the end of an era when Shayne Lee made the move to Queensland in January. His enthusiasm and willingness to take crews out at short notice gave many the opportunity to row. His departure was a loss to the club and it was a collective effort from a core group of people that stepped up and ensured we were able to continue to boat up crews.

The club had representation at all but one of the carnivals held in Victoria with crews being entered in both the Male Reserves (Rams) and Male U23 (Bow-Ties). There were some solid hit outs by both crews with the most notable result being a silver medal for the Rams at the LSV Victorian Championships. The club also competed at the LSV Victorian Masters with the Rams (180 Male) and the Wethers (160 Male) winning silver and bronze respectively.

The Rams traveled interstate, first to the rescheduled ASRL Open at Mollymook where they came fourth in the 180 Masters, just missing out on a medal in a tight finish. The final carnival for the season was the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. In small surf the Rams made the final in the 180 Masters, only to come agonisingly short once again, finishing fourth. The crew also entered the Male Reserves and were unlucky not to qualify for the knockout rounds.

Jan Juc Boats are in a building phase and the key to a sustainable future for the section will be attracting young rowers and developing them. For season 2021/22 we will be looking to boat up crews across several divisions with a focus on participation and building for the long term.

SPONSORSHIP+ FUNDRAISING REPORT



To say this year has thrown some curve balls at us is an understatement. In my seven years as a Board Member, we haven't seen anything like this situation and hopefully we never do again. As I reflect on my report from last year and the uncertainty that presented with the outbreak of Covid and the unknown of whether we would have a season, let alone events, or social gatherings, it amazes me about how much we were able to achieve in the past 12 months.

The most significant milestone was the official opening of the new clubhouse. The culmination of the biggest fundraising effort in the history of the club. This is a milestone that all members, past and present should be extremely proud of. This was a vision that has spanned almost 20 years and on the back of our hallmark events, philanthropic donations and grants, this vision became a reality in 2021. Thank you to everyone who has been involved in making this a reality. This is a legacy project that sets the club up for the next 50 years.

Covid threw so many challenges at all surf clubs and as a Board, we took an extremely conservative approach to the 2020/21 season, with the view that we may not have been able to conduct any events. Due to our strong financial position and robust fiscal management, this position enabled us to look at all our hallmark events with a 'nice to conduct if safe' rather than 'needing to' strategy. All decisions were made with the safety of our volunteers and participants at the forefront of our planning.

Unfortunately, the first of our events to fall victim to the Covid restrictions was the Grand Final Eve lunch. Planning is underway for our 2021 event, and we are looking to bounce back bigger and better than ever. Other key fundraising activities that we had to make an early call on were the Intersection Collections and Nippers Door Knock. We felt that these activities whilst important to our club's financial success were not that important that we put our volunteers at risk. Difficult decisions continued to be made throughout the season as the Covid situation continually changed.

As the season unfolded and restrictions lifted, our ability to operate became clearer. We were able to reopen the clubhouse and in particular our social activities. Through the hard work of so many people - in particular Stew Talbot and Pete Smith - we were finally able to open the clubhouse for social activities. Although our primary objective was to reconnect our members, it soon became clear that this was a need for the entire local community and as the months

progressed the clubhouse became a fantastic gathering point for so many in the community and quickly became an amazing revenue source for our club. The vision of Stew and his team of volunteers introduced live music and food vans to really add to the family atmosphere of Fridays and Sundays. To everyone that contributed to the success of the social activities we cannot thank you enough for the hours of dedication and commitment in helping us fill an enormous revenue hole left though the loss of key events.

The uncertainty of Covid continued to cause concerns over our ability to safely run the Danger Swim Series, Bells Bash and Golf Classic. Each having their own set of restrictions that limited our ability to comfortably commit both from a safety perspective and financial perspective. We were extremely fortunate to be able to progress with the Golf Classic and thank you to Daryl Moss, Jeremy Bond, Andrew Isaac, and their team of volunteers for all their hard work to get this event up in such a short time frame and with a limited

field restriction. To all our loyal participants and sponsors for the day, thank you for your support in making this one of our most successful days financially, despite the reduction in capacity.

Unfortunately, the restrictions didn't allow us to progress with our two hallmark events, the Danger Swim Series and Bells Bash. The Board felt that the risks associated with running the events were too great however we did run, what became popular over Covid, a virtual event. Whilst not as financially rewarding as our live events, it enabled us to keep our events and our club brand top of mind with our competitors, whilst still raising some funds that helped in a difficult year.

One of the shining lights in our fundraising efforts was merchandising sales which continued to grow as we saw our new pre-ordering system become an overwhelming success. This not only de-risked the club financially and its need to hold stock in the hope of selling it, but it also enabled for better planning and inventory management. It was our first year with our new club brand and the feedback has been fantastic and we look forward to building on this in the coming years. A big thank you to Caroline Flanagan, Mel Taylor and their team of volunteers who have helped continue to elevate our merchandise in both sales and quality.

Our fundraising also reaches beyond just the above activities, with grants and philanthropic donations playing a significant role for the club. The club has been extremely successful over the past twelve months with grants assisting all areas of the club with funds for equipment and training. Post the opening of the new clubhouse our philanthropic efforts have continued to enable us to finish off key projects within the redevelopment and we thank all those additional donors for their support.

This year saw a new communications team come on board headed by James Taylor. I would like to acknowledge our previous Communications Manager Jaci Chin-Jewson for her years of service and dedication to this role. This is a huge role for the club as we continue to grow and the need to reach so many members across many different mediums. James and his team have done an outstanding job and we are continuing to look at better ways to keep our members informed.

Our sponsorship efforts surprised us in what we thought would be a difficult period for all businesses. To our valued partners we thank you for your support in tough times. To our

members, please get behind these businesses and show our appreciation of their support.

We achieved so many highlights in my role for the 2020/21 season - thank you to our entire membership base for your continued support across all our fundraising efforts that we were able to deliver. The upcoming season may still present us with some challenges but please continue to support the club in whatever capacity you can so we can continue to build on the amazing culture and club that we have.







FINANCE REPORT

The 2021 financial year will go down in Club history as a year like no other! I am very pleased to report that we have been able to successfully navigate the financial impacts of building redevelopment completion, along with the impacts of Covid 19 on our financial performance.

At the date of this financial report the club is in a strong financial position and is in a position to navigate (if required) another year of Covid 19 disruption, though we sincerely hope this is not the case!

The club's audited financial statements report an accounting profit for the 2021 year of \$437,432. This compares to a reported profit for 2020 of \$3,886,399.

Both years contain the accounting impact of significant non-operating items relating to the redevelopment of the clubhouse. The 2021 year also contains further non ongoing revenues in the form of Covid 19 grants and subsidies (including jobkeeper), as well as the impact of 6 months depreciation associated with the new clubhouse – a non-cash item.

Excluding clubhouse redevelopment grant and donations revenue, non-ongoing Covid 19 related revenues and subsidies, and depreciation expense, the underlying cash profit for 2021 was \$48,051. In 2020 the same underlying cash profit was \$98,705.

To report an underlying 'ongoing operational' cash profit of \$48,051 in 2021 is an incredibly pleasing outcome given the financial uncertainties faced by the Club at this time last year.

There is no doubt Covid 19 did negatively impact our operations. We were not able to generate usual fundraising profits through our Grand Final Eve function, Danger Swim Series, Bells Bash, Nipper Doorknock, or intersection collections. While the Golf Classic went ahead and was a great success - as was the impromptu spin off fundraiser for the mounted TVs in the Bar – it's contribution was also curtailed by attendance limitations. However, the support of our members through a 39% growth in our underlying membership revenue to a record amount of over \$100,000, and of our members and their guests through patronage of our (sometimes Covid 19 constrained) Friday/Sunday social events and Bar, we were able to significantly offset the lost fundraising event income.

Significant thanks must go to the expanded ranks of volunteers, ably led by Stewy Talbot, who have enabled the Bar to cope with the growth in demand over this period and with the ever changing requirements of Covid 19 operating restrictions. It looks like our Friday/Sunday social timetable will provide significant social and financial capital to the club in the coming years, with the volunteer efforts generating a direct financial benefit for the club.

Business as usual within a Covid 19 affected operating year

Outside of memberships, fundraising, bar and building redevelopment, the core 'business as usual' areas of the club have remained very stable financially. Clubhouse costs, lifesaving services, lifesaving skills and development, juniors, competition, and operational capital equipment expenditure have all reported stable, predictable financial outcomes, within plans and budgets.

Income and expenses across these core club activity areas showed little unexpected material variance over levels of income and expenses in 2020.

There were no other significant business as usual variances of note. Sound monitoring and cost control by club committee and executive have ensured no surprise outcomes across core areas.

Thanks go again to Meagan Mifsud (bookkeeper) and to Sue Bettanin for her support of the finance function. The finance team has had a busy year supporting the administration of the delivery of our new Clubhouse and the initial phase of social events and Bar operations, and in navigating the crisis funding opportunities and associated requirements arising under Covid 19 relief gra nts and subsidies. We are fortunate to have a dedicated and capable accounting and administration function.

Clubhouse development project completed

The year saw the completion of the scope of the Clubhouse redevelopment project, with the recognition of all remaining grant income and with all project expenditure being reallocated to the club's fixed asset register. The financial components of this activity during the year included:

- \$1,092,637 in capitalised project development costs (2020: \$5,139,529) bringing the total 'Buildings' capital cost at year end to \$6,753,544. (2020: \$5,660,907).
- Recognition of capital grants revenue during the year of \$460,000 (2020 \$3,708,000).
- Recognition of further building redevelopment philanthropic income in the form of donations made and treads sold of \$63,800 this year. This compares to \$115,500 in 2020.
- The Club entered into a loan agreement with Bendigo Bank and had fully drawn down on a \$400,000 debt facility as of 30 April 2020. Bendigo Bank agreed to a Covid 19 related 6-month deferral of repayments of principal and interest. Repayments recommenced in November 2020.

At year end, all outstanding project commitments to builders and associated consultants and from contracted funders, are reflected in the financial statements.


Maintaining our operating assets - continued investment

The club invested \$39,597 in plant and equipment during the year, including for completing the acquisition of 'The Sedge' surfboat & oars, 5 Rescue Boards, 2 sponsored surf skis, 1 emergency 'hospital' stretcher and 2 televisions and mounts. \$52,560 was invested in fixtures and fittings, including for a cool room, beer systems, door lock systems and storage cabinetry. Additionally, at year end the club had deposits and/or backorders with suppliers for a number of assets including function room furniture (chairs) and a 'dumb waiter', which are included in the capital budget for 2022.

Impact of Covid 19 on the Financial Statements

The impact of Covid 19 on future club operations remains uncertain as at the date of signing of these financial statements. Notwithstanding, the Club has prepared scenario based cashflow forecasts that indicate that the club will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due, under reasonably forseeable scenarios, including under a 'worst case' scenario where Covid 19 severely curtails our peak 2021/2022 operating period resulting in the cancellation of all of our events and operations other than the provision of core beach patrols.
