PRESIDENTS REPORT

My first season as President of this great club has been a real learning experience. I couldn't have done it without the solid and continuing support of the current board as well as some help and advice from past presidents and board members. I would especially like to thank Current Vice President, Pete Smith, for his constant support throughout the year.

The Clubhouse has been well utilised this season by all members and the community for events, meetings, and general get-togethers, which has been great to see. Although the best night this season would have to have been the 'Sunset Soiree' a celebration of our 60th year. What a great night! Lots of faces - both new and old assisting us in the celebration of the first 60 years of the club from the 60's through to today, with nostalgic photo montages running on all the screens, memorabilia from past achievements and awards, and plenty of mingling from all areas of the club. As we look to the future we have a new Club Utility arriving next season (in this season's budget), and also need to look at updating some of our IRBs, which will be budgeted for next season. As a club, we are in great shape moving forward. Memberships are still increasing steadily in the 18+ area although we have dropped off slightly in other areas from nippers through to U/18, This is an issue right across the country in surf-lifesaving and other volunteer-based activities. This is something we are well and truly aware of and are actively working to negate this trend as much as possible.



A few key areas of the club I would like to expand on:

Life-Saving Services

This season Grace Lightfoot and her team have done an amazing job keeping our patrols on the beach. Our numbers have been down in patrols and we have regarded this as our most important concern to address for the coming 2023/24 summer season. We are continually working in this area to try and boost our Bronze holder numbers by actively advertising throughout the community for Bronze camp, which will ultimately boost our patrolling numbers from outside our current membership, not just relying on nipper numbers coming through. We are aware of current retention numbers in and around the 15-18 age group, where we are dropping in numbers. Grace has been working this season on ideas to make patrols 'more fun', including activities and training that can be done during patrol. We look forward to seeing these ideas come to fruition next season.



Jan Juc Surf Lifesaving Club turned 60 Years in 2023, representing a magnificent milestone. From very humble beginnings, started by a group of people dedicated to setting up a Lifesaving Club to provide water and beach safety to a growing number of beach users, to now be considered one of the major Clubs in Victorian Lifesaving.

The achievements gained over this period can never be underestimated. From building additions, done on an "as needs" basis over the years, culminating in the great facility that now stands on the original site. From day one, the Club has always had a "family culture," and thankfully, this continues. Many members having an ongoing connection for decades.

The Club has been at the forefront of areas such as training & nippers, with our ideas and actions being accepted by other Clubs and LSV. The extensive training provided to Members has enabled them to utilise these skills and discipline in employment, personal development and general life.

Club Membership figures this year were down from 1480 the previous year to 1180 now. Social and Associate Memberships representing the bulk of the number decline. Other benefits for patrolling members have commenced, with valuable patroller discounts for specified over and above patrolling hours being introduced.

Personally, it was a privilege to represent the Club in reaching the final of the Viva Energy volunteers campaign, earning the Club \$3000, together with the exposure to the public of Jan Juc SLSC activities. Thank you to all those whovoted and to the Oxspring Family for the original nomination.

Jumping back to the 60th, what a celebration with over 220 people enjoying fine food, a memorabilia room filled with classic photos and slide shows by decade beaming down from the TVs. There were many memories joyfully re-lived. Congratulations to all involved in the organising.

Club wise - special thanks to Davina Jackson, who has spent countless hours compiling a schedule of past patrol hours, state & club awards, and patrol service hours almost from the Club's beginnings to current times. All this information will be uploaded to Club History records.

The Tower – ah yes, the Tower - humbled with the thought and consideration behind the naming of the tower. The recognition of 55 years of patrol at the 2023 Presentation Night was also much appreciated. That's a lot of looking out to sea on hot and cold days – but worth every minute.



LIFESAVING SERVICES GRACE LIGHTFOOT

This season, Juc patrolled just over 50 days, successfully filling patrols every weekend and public holiday from November 2022 to ANZAC day. Each of our seven patrols teams completed eight patrols each for the season, this is a mammoth effort, and I would like to thank every patrol member for this.

In November we had our Men's Mental Health Patrol where we had a core patrol of male leaders. Jay Moss and Sam Dripps, the patrol captains engaged with all patrol members to create a place of support to encourage people to share, have conversations and check in with each other. President Thommo, organised a crew of boaties & members to come down to help put on a BBQ for the patrol members.

Juc celebrated 10 years of Pink Patrol in March, in line with International Women's Day. This was an especially exciting day as pink club bathers had been ordered to mark the occasion! With over 90 pairs of pink bathers ordered by our clubbies, including our male champions of change, the beach became pink for the day. With over 30 people coming down to patrol it was great to see nippers right up to life members in their pink. Betty's Burgers catered the day bringing burgers and chips for everyone to enjoy. Following pink patrol we had an afternoon tea in the club. Huge thank you to our female core patrol team and Jodie Reyntjes for making this day happen!





LIFESAVING SERVICES

GRACE LIGHTFOOT

This season we had seven Core Patrols Teams, which were made up of 30 core members. These core members are leaders from the club, have gained all awards necessary for their position, and are experienced in patrol operations. The objective of the core group is to ensure our patrols are equipped with a strong group of leaders, to cover the compulsory awards, and to upskill active members into core positions as well. We also had over 200 Active Patrollers this season; these members selected the best days for them to patrol.

Working alongside our beach Lifesavers, Jan Juc again hosted a Life Saving Victoria, RWC (rescue watercraft or jetski) service. This service was used by both Lifesavers and Lifeguards. This season our call-out team and off-duty members also executed several successful off-duty responses, including helping Victoria Police locate a missing stand-up paddle boarder in strong Easter swells.

We are so incredibly proud of all our Lifesavers this season who managed thousands of people a day, strong rips, and challenging surf conditions. They are the reason thousands of people are kept safe at our beach over the summer and help ensure everyone has a great beach day.

LSV Leadership Development Camps

We had three participants selected to attend the LSV U13 Leadership Development Camp – Archie McKie, Niamh Napper and Lachlan Thomas. They joined 54 youth from across 28 Victorian clubs to develop their interpersonal skills, broaden their understanding of lifesaving and support participants as they progress through their lifesaving journey.

We also had two applicants – Julia Drohan and Summer Stewart - selected to attend the U15 LSV Leadership Development Camp held from 5-7 May at the YMCA Anglesea Recreation Camp – a fun-filled weekend of thought-provoking activities designed to develop participants' knowledge of self and their teammates, while learning the fundamental skills of leadership.

Victorian Junior Life Saving Championships

The Victorian Junior State Championships threw up many challenges with some huge surf for our Juniors over the three days of competition! Our Juc kids proved how strong, courageous, and determined they are by beating the elements and producing some more spectacular results... not to mention their amazing sportsmanship and care for their teammates. Jan Juc finished 7th Victorian club overall on the points tally. We couldn't be prouder of all of the kids' efforts over three long days of racing.

Our dedicated group of parents, including coaches, team managers, officials, and water safety volunteers, generously donate their time every Wednesday and Sunday, as well as on Carnival weekends, to support our Nippers program. They not only coach the children and develop training programs but also ensure their safety in the water and provide opportunities to compete in carnivals throughout the season. Regardless of the varying abilities among the kids, these parents work tirelessly to enhance their lifesaving and competition skills while offering unwavering support.

Victorian Junior Pool Life Saving Championships

STARFISH NIPPERS

STEVE JEWSON & JACI CHIN-JEWSON

Starfish Nippers is a modified and structured nipper program designed for children and young adults living with special needs aged from 6 years and older with one-on-one supervision. It runs alongside a Club's Summer Nipper Program and focuses on beach and water safety and awareness and promotes inclusion and diversity. It features modified nippers beach and water activities such as games, running, beach flags, wading, swimming, and boards as well as activities with the club's Age Group Nippers. We are always looking for more volunteers as our program continues to grow.

We had an outstanding group of 8 Starfish Nippers this season – Xavier, Flynn, Georgia, Humphrey, Marley, Marlon, Rufus, and Tilly - each who brought their unique personality, resilience, courage and enthusiasm to the beach each day. After much commentary on the community social media pages, we decided to take the club's beach accessibility chairs down to Fisherman's Beach for a 'come and try' day. This highlighted the difficulties people living with disabilities experience if they want to simply visit the beach and maybe get their toes wet.

We decided it would be a great idea to have one of our chairs located at Fisherman's Beach, and the Torquay Angling Club and Torquay Marine Rescue came to the party to house the chair and manage bookings. It became evident that, despite the good intentions of three community organisations, this would not work. We are all volunteers and cannot always be available. Steve and I had a few meetings with GORCAPA and the Surf Coast Shire, and we have managed to come to an arrangement where GORCAPA manage our chair and bookings, and the Shire keeps all the information on their website. We are still far from perfecting the process, but a start has been made

We are also forming a working group with interested club members, with the goal being to provide more opportunities within the Jan Juc SLSC for people living with disabilities to participate in all aspects of the club.

Our greater aim is to be able to create some pathways to patrolling (alongside a mentor), which could include radio communications, first aid, and surf rescue certificate or bronze medallion – finding solutions to physical barriers. There is a strong area for growth and opportunity to improve access and inclusion for people living with disabilities within Jan Juc SLSC, and our focus is to be more reflective of the community. Surf Life Saving can be a place for everyone. The NDIS has offered to meet us where we are at and work towards making positive changes together to improve access and inclusion in our club.

Education around the culture of our club and the community's attitudes towards people living with a disability is an imperative part of their role, and we look forward to working with them to build awareness, understanding, access, and inclusion. TRAINING & ASSESSMENT DAVINA JACKSON

Season 2022/23 has seen the return to new 'normal' delivery of courses and use of training resources, particularly manikins in resuscitation training. It is pleasing to see the continued enthusiasm of members to expand their skill set and expertise through the great teamwork of learning and working with peers of all ages.

We are fortunate in continuing to access grants and funding to update and expand the Club's quality training equipment to ensure we are self-sufficient in delivery of a variety courses across the extent of the Lifesaving awards. Training resources are now registered in the LSV Gear and Equipment Management System (GEMS). Thank you to the Training team members who helped prepare the equipment and resources for a very efficient Gear Inspection earlier in the season.

This season Jan Juc Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators (TAFs) delivered a total of 36 courses, including seven Skills Maintenance sessions, where six awards were assessed each session. Total courses encompassed 355 candidates at Jan Juc alone. 240 new lifesaving awards were achieved (Please see following pages for a detailed list). This requires multiple TAFs, water safety, and helpers volunteering their time, a huge effort; thanks to everyone involved.

Some of our TAFs helped deliver courses at six other Clubs; assisting and mentoring other TAFs whilst consolidating our reputation for quality delivery and inclusiveness of all lifesaving members. We delivered the most accredited (Health Unit Courses) in the State. 35 new Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator awards were achieved, bringing our TAF awards to a current total of 158 awards across 28 people, one of strongest teams in the State, supported by a structured Jan Juc succession plan developed over 10 years ago.





After two years of delivering the newer SLSA Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) & Bronze Medallion (BM) curriculum, the Bronze Medallion Bridging course (proficient SRC members transitioning to BM) was successfully delivered, meaning the six day intensive BM course was reduced to four days. An efficient use of time and member resources. The SLSA Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award has been rolled out, replacing the Silver Medallion Beach Management. This is a new award where Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and Beach Leaders will have two years to undertake the new award to transition across. Very positive feedback about the relevance of learning, has been received from candidates so far.

Some of our experienced Facilitators and Assessors were asked to participate in State System Matter Expert groups to review Bronze Medallion and Skills Maintenance questions and resource lists, and more recently, update and restructure the Side-by-Side Vehicle Operator (SSV) award. On behalf of LSV (in my role of State Training and Assessment Resource Officer) thank you to Dean Sibun, Will McCance, Steve Scammell and Jemma Ugrin, for your knowledge and expertise.

Key priorities for Training and Assessment over the next 12 months include:

- Providing multiple opportunities in an inclusive and supported environment, for a diverse range of members to undertake lifesaving awards. This includes land based awards for members not aquatically inclined. There is a place for everyone to help out Jan Juc
- Continuing the delivery of the Bronze Medallion Bridging course to eligible candidates
- Piloting for LSV, the new Skills Maintenance App on the iPad for same-day electronic processing
- Promote interclub award training across the Surf Coast Area
- Complete the IT setup of the lower floor Training rooms
- Assist in updating the Club website with current Training and Assessment information.

- Earlier delivery of multiple courses in readiness for patrolling - Silver Medallion Patrol Captain (SMPC), IRBC, SMIRBD, SSV operator, and Health Unit courses, including annual Resuscitation courses to maintain 3-yearly Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) & First Aid (FA)
- Continue to provide opportunities for supported TAF development and succession planning, in particular, for new Trainers beginning their journey with the Training Officer Certificate theory (TOC)

Special thanks to Geoff 'Rass' Thompstone for his expertise and long hours in processing Skills and Maintenance proficiencies, not only for all our Club members but across the State in his role of Surf Coast Assistant Training and Assessment Officer.

Thank you to Club members and all Trainers, Assessors, and Facilitators for your continued support in Jan Juc's area of Lifesaving Skills Development; your time, efforts, and skill sets are greatly appreciated.

It has been a pleasure working with Julia Clarke – Surf Coast Area Training and Assessment Officer, and the knowledgeable LSV Volunteer Training staff. We look forward to you joining us in 2023/24 for your next course.

FINANCE REPORT

MELISSA FIELD

I am pleased to report sound results again this year for Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club. 2023 is our first 'normal' financially operating year in our new clubhouse, after the last few years of heavily Covid impacted financial operations.

The club's audited financial statements report an accounting profit before depreciation (a non cash item) for the 2023 year of \$150,246, and a loss after depreciation of \$78,152. This compares to a reported loss after depreciation for 2022 of \$52,793. These results include receipt of a \$50,000 distribution from the estate of the late Richard Ibbotson, a former member of our club. As noted in the subsequent events note of the financial statements, a further \$370,000 distribution from Richard's estate was received in June 2023. This \$370,000 will be recorded as income in the 2024 financial year. I'd like to gratefully acknowledge this bequest and the fact that our club life meant so much to Richard.

Operations

Core activities, including lifesaving operations (patrols), lifesaving skills development (SRC, Bronze, and other training courses), junior and senior competitions, nippers, and surf education, were all conducted at full strength over the season, and while there were some financial overs and unders in particular club operational areas, overall, the club operated within budget and expectations for the financial year.

After a significant jump in membership in 2021 and 2022 (with membership revenue up 29% in 2021 and a further 17% in 2022), membership revenue dropped back a bit this year, declining by 21%. Changes in nipper age group offerings by other clubs locally, meaning Jan Juc SLSC is no longer the sole club offering U7 nippers, contributed to the drop year on year. Notwithstanding, 2023 membership revenue remains 30% above 2020 levels, the last season before Covid and the completion of the new clubhouse.

Through the generous support of our volunteers operating the club bar and supporting events, bar operations, social and outside events also contributed a net profit of \$44,597 to the club, an increase on the \$34,445 contribution from 2022. The valued efforts of our volunteer coordinators and support teams saw a range of fundraising events deliver good returns to the club. The Golf Day Golf Day contributed a net \$17,578 and the Grand Final Eve event – back for the first time since 2019 – contributing a net \$13,970. The Danger Swim Series also staged a successful 'prime time' January return and contributed a net \$11,455 to the club.

Maintaining our assets - continued investment

The club has been successful in accessing a variety of capital grants and sponsorships this year and this combined with the support of other fundraising activities has enabled us to continue to invest in operational equipment this year. The club invested \$55,624 in assets during the year, somewhat less than the \$152,168 in 2022. The club was anticipating to have completed the acquisition of an Isuzu ute during the year, but due to supply chain delays, the delivery of this ute is now expected in the 2024 financial year. Assets acquired during the year included a Polaris Ranger ATV, Clubhouse audio and sound system, security cameras, honour boards and signage, bifold doors for the kitchen, and a replacement shark alarm for the tower.

Cashflow and financial position

As at year-end total bank borrowings outstanding was only \$198 compared to \$174,843 at the end of 2022. In a rising interest rate environment, the club has elected to utilise available cash to pay out bank borrowings during the year. In addition to carrying no bank debt as at 30 April 2023, the club had cash balances on hand totalling \$141,547. Yes, I will say this again – as it is something all members can be reassured by: At year end the club is debt free and also carries good cash reserves, totalling \$141,547 (noting that cash reserves include a \$50,000 initial distribution from the Richard Ibbotson Estate.)

Not having any overhang of borrowings in the current interest rate environment and having sufficient cash on hand to support ongoing operations and to actually invest in a way that best supports club future needs, is an outstanding financial position for the club to be in so soon after its redevelopment.

Thanks go again to Meagan Mifsud (bookkeeper) and to Anita Craven and, earlier in the year, Amy Newton, for their support of the finance function.

Thank you also to my fellow board members and to past board members who have navigated the last 6 years of club life with me. This will be my last report to you all as Finance Manager. While at times, the circumstances through the rebuild and Covid were challenging, I have always had sound support from my peer Board members and from many long-standing members and past executive of the club. This has made the last six years very rewarding. I look forward to providing the same support to those who put up their hands next to help lead the club forward.

The Audit, Finance and Governance Committee (the Committee) was established at a Special General Meeting by the members on February 21, 2016.

Roles and Responsibilities

The Committee is an independent advisory committee elected by members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Members of the Committee are appointed for up to 3 years. To minimise loss of corporate memory, approximately half of the Committee members retire on a rotational basis at each AGM, where new members are appointed. The number of Committee members is capped at 5, including the President or their representative as an ex-officio member. The purpose of the Committee is to review budgetary, financial reporting, risk management, internal controls, and fiscal proprietary and special projects of the Association throughout the operating year. The Objectives of the Committee are generally described in the Club's Constitution.

Reporting Framework

This report is prepared by the Committee to provide the Association's members with details of its activities from the previous AGM through to June of the following year.

In addition, the Committee reviewed the financial accounts on a monthly basis through productive and regular discussions with the Club's Finance Director; this was important in understanding the continued recovery from the impact of COVID-19 on Club activity over the last two years.

In the Committee's opinion, the Club has managed the impacts of COVID-19 on its operations and finances and has positioned itself well to expand its activity level and functions to pre-COVID levels over the forthcoming seasons. The Committee does not see any material financial matters that are required to be brought to the attention of members. Given the Club's financial capacity and the standard of its on-hand life-saving equipment, the Committee does not recommend the transfer of surplus funds to the Life Saving Services Fund at this stage.

I'd like to again thank the Committee members for continuing to volunteer their valuable time and contributions toward delivering the work of the Committee, including the Club's Finance Director Melissa Field for her overview of finances and Board matters.

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES
